




Berkshire County opioid OD deaths have ranged between 32-45 over the past 5 years.



In MA, opioid OD deaths have tripled in the last decade.



Since 2018, Berkshire County opioid OD death rates per capita have exceeded overall MA per capita averages.





- Berkshire County follows one yr behind MA state trends
- Stabilization of opioid OD death rates in recent yrs
- Problems with data
 - Not up to date
 - Population data inaccurate



In Berkshire County, men comprise ~75% of OD deaths despite being only 50% of population.








Which factors make men more likely to die of an opioid overdose?




By Age: Berkshire County Opioid OD Deaths



- Increase in OD deaths among 25-34 age cohort in recent years
- In 2020, spike in OD deaths among 15-24 age cohort
- Elderly populations less affected





Racial Composition of Berkshire County








- Whites comprise majority of OD deaths













- Greater % of OD deaths in these municipalities than would be expected, even despite their larger populations



By Municipality: Relative Opioid Deaths




- 1.8x and 4.5x more likely per capita to die of an opioid OD in North Adams than Pittsfield & Adams respectively
- 6.7x more likely per capita to die of an opioid OD in North Adams than other municipalities




For every 100 people per capita that die of an OD in North Adams, x # of people die in other municipalities


In MA, opioid OD deaths are a result of a rise in Fentanyl, which has offset the decline in Heroin.



In Berkshire County, Fentanyl contributed to more than 85% of all overdose deaths.



Almost 90% of opioid overdose deaths in Berkshire County resulted from a mix of drugs.



- Fentanyl heavily represented in OD death toxicology reports
- Majority of opioid OD deaths include a mix of drugs
- Data Limitations
 - Several deaths listed as "opioids"
